Lowry Bridge

[Editor's Note: This article was finished almost exactly one hour before the Hwy 35 bridge over the Mississippi River collapsed. Our thoughts and prayers go out to those involved or hurt and to the families of those still missing.]

The original bridge on this site was built in 1887. In the late 1950's the bridge was replaced and lifted 20' primarily to accommodate barge traffic. (See photo below.) A few years ago, the bridge deck was replaced and the bridge repainted. It was discovered during the course of repairs and that one of the piers had shifted up to 11". That initiated the County thoughts about replacing the bridge sooner than later.

According to Jim Grube, an engineer for the County, this is not the only pier that is reported to have shifted in the over 100 year history of the bridge (the current bridge is only about 60 years old.) As part of this work, the County hired the consulting team of SRF Consulting Group and TY Lin International. Between the two they list over 40 bridge projects from the Bloomington Ferry Bridge to the Lanier Bridge in Sydney, Australia. A Project Advisory Committee (PAC) has been formed with members from the consulting team, County, City, DNR, Army Corps, MnDoT, neighborhoods and businesses. Their task is to develop the 'larger picture' design elements – what kind of bridge should it be, how long should it be, where should the bike paths be located and other similar questions. Public input is more than welcome. If you would like to express your ideas about the new bridge, one of at least two public meetings has been scheduled.

Rain Barrels

Where: These low cost rain barrels can be purchased at Hennepin County's Drop-off Facility in Brooklyn Park, and are available only to Hennepin County residents on a first come, first serve basis.

Gabby's Update

BNA received notice that an Administrative Law Judge hearing regarding Gabby's Saloon & Eatery originally scheduled for late July has been postponed to September.

Earlier this year, the City and Gabby's management were unable to reach agreement on actions and conditions on the establishment's liquor license. The City then requested the administrative hearing. This is like a mini-trial of sorts. Each side presents its case to a judge who then deliberates and issues an opinion supporting one side or the other or perhaps even some middle ground. This is not a public hearing so we will have to wait for the judge's decision which will probably be in late September or October, depending on when the hearing is rescheduled.

Soccer and Football Registration

Fall youth football and soccer for boys and girls. Players must be 8 years old by September 1, 2007, and not turn 16 until after September 1, 2007. Practices begin in mid to late August, and the season runs through October. Games are on Saturdays and some evenings beginning around September 8th. Practice times are generally evenings Monday through Thursday. Players are provided a full uniform, and all uniforms must be returned at the end of the season.

You may have noticed that work on this park has started. Completion is scheduled for this fall, weather and construction schedules permitting. Amenities include new picnic tables, benches, an overlook at the riverbank, pathways, a drinking fountain, and a gazebo. The parking lot will also be resurfaced. The park, which has been closed since 2004, will remain fenced off until construction is complete. Landscaping of the park, including new flowerbeds, will be done in spring 2008.

Gluek Park was closed in May 2004 because of ground contamination resulting from prior manufacturing in the area. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) began remediation that year; however, federal emergencies delayed the project. Remediation, which finished in late fall 2006, included the removal of a two-foot layer of asbestos-contaminated soil, paths, tables, benches, the gazebo, shrubs, and trees; turf replacement; reduction in the steepness of the bank; and shoreline stabilization. The former well has also been sealed due to contamination unrelated to asbestos. The new drinking fountain replaces the well.

Fitol-Hintz Construction, Inc, based in St. Paul is doing the work.

Bottineau NECP

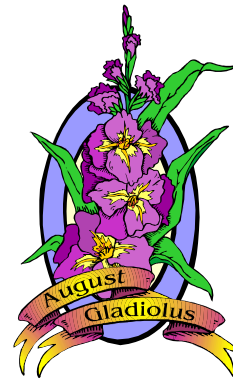
